Arrival date to Vancouver and Bodwell

If you are going to live in boarding, you must arrive on either



No check-ins are allowed before August 25. You can check in to your rooms only from the day you fully begin to stay overnight.

August 25 and 26 will be very busy on campus, so please expect fewer boarding activities than usual. Expect a lot more activities once the semester begins!


*Students coming for Mid-Semester intake in November or April should confirm their arrival and orientation dates with the school first.

Location:


Bodwell is located in the City of North Vancouver, overlooking the harbour. It takes approximately 45-60 minutes by taxi from Vancouver International Airport, and 20-30 minutes from downtown Vancouver.

How to receive your study permit/visa at the airport

After landing, go to the Visa Issuance Counter. This is different from the general immigration counter, and is located on the farright side. If not sure, ask the airport staff by showing your Study Permit Approval Letter.



IMPORTANT

You MUST get the official Study Permit document

BEFORE leaving the airport!

At the Visa Issuance Counter, show these required documents:

- Valid passport.
- Study Permit Approval Letter: This is just an approval letter, not an official study permit document. You will receive the official Study Permit in exchange with this letter.
- 3 Letter of Acceptance from Bodwell
- (4) Bank statement (in English)
- (school or your homestay)
- 6 Copy of custodian declaration form, if you are under 19 (including declaration from parents and custodian).



Sample Questions from Arrival Officer

An officer at the Visa Issuance Counter will ask several questions to determine your eligibility. You need to answer these questions in simple but clear expressions. Avoid using words such as "maybe" and "about."



Submit contact information for you as parents/guardians



It is very important that we have accurate and secure contact information regarding your child, as direct and timely communication is key to your child's success and safety.

If your contact information changes throughout your child's time at Bodwell, please alert your child's counsellor without delay.

Which courses am I going to be taking?

Please note that course selection is an essential part of your academic journey, especially toward meeting graduation and university requirements. In order to ensure a smooth course registration process, we have certain priorities.

Priority for course selection will be given in the following order:

- 1 Students who have completed the Duolingo English Test prior to their arrival.
- 2 Students who attend Orientation Day.

In other words, students who miss Orientation Day and have not taken the Duolingo English Test in advance may be LIMITED when selecting preferred courses. Be sure not to miss out!

Your counselor will assist you on your journey at Bodwell

Bodwell has a team of caring school counsellors. Prior to your arrival, you will be assigned your own counsellor as an important guide through your Bodwell life.

Your counsellor will get in contact with new students and parents a few weeks before you arrive, to learn more about your goals and needs. Please ask any questions you have so far.

No, but be assured we will match you with a very helpful counsellor to guide you through your school life. Sometimes your counsellor may also speak your first language as an added support.

Where am I going to live?







If you are a boarding student, you will live right here on CAMPUS. We're busy these days making sure you are placed in a school house (e.g. Courage, Harmony, etc. – think Harry Potter!), in a hall with other boys or girls, and in a comfortable room together with 1-3 other students from different places in the world. Younger students live in Junior Halls, and older students live in Senior Halls.

Can you choose or change your room? No, please leave that to us. You'll find out your new hall, room and roommates when you arrive – what suspense.

It might feel a bit different than living at home, and it might take some time to get used to new food, roommates, and routines. Sometimes roommates even become friends for life. Our Boarding Administrators and Advisors will help you with all your living needs.













Parents may be keen to visit your child's boarding room when you arrive. For student privacy reasons, we can only allow this at a designated time during Orientation. We'll let you know more soon.

What if I have allergies or medical conditions, and can't eat some foods?

Bodwell caters as best possible to the needs and preferences of our global students. For boarding students far from home, getting used to cafeteria meals means being open-minded to try new foods, as well as planning using available meal options. Students should check the <u>Weekly Menu</u> in advance and review offerings, asking questions when unsure.





Some students have dietary requirements due to allergies or medical conditions. For certain reasonable and moderate needs, after evaluation and school approval, we'll arrange as best possible to accommodate these needs. Students with documented medical conditions requiring special diets must submit a medical note from a certified healthcare professional. For more information, see <u>HERE</u>.



How to confirm your English level?

Of course, many of you have been working hard to improve your English language skills.

Before anything: We need an accurate measure of your English language skills in advance, so we can prepare exactly the right classes to help you best. Don't worry, if you struggle, we will guide you to become even better!



Student who have not taken the Duolingo English Test in advance must take an English Test during New Student Orientation and may be LIMITED when selecting preferred courses.

What do I need to bring?

It's good to start preparing what you'll need to bring to Bodwell. A key point: DON'T bring a lot! Many of you will be sharing a dormitory room with limited space. The less you have, the easier it is to be clean and tidy. Bring only TWO suitcases maximum, and suitcases should not be expensive. During semester breaks, you can store two suitcases at most. In general, if you need something, you can buy it online or here in Vancouver.

Protect yourself: Although Vancouver is generally safe, DON'T bring anything too expensive (jewelry, etc.), so as not to attract attention. Do not bring or carry a big amount of cash. You should protect your valuables by locking them up at all times. This is each student's responsibility.



Get Ready!

Essential Documents

- Passport (for international students)
- Study permit (for international students)
- Letter of acceptance from the school (print)
- Health insurance documents (print)
- Unlocked mobile phone (SIM-ready)
- Documents submitted for obtaining a student permit

Clothing

- Black dress shoes (REQUIRED for your uniform)
- Athletic shoes / sneakers
- Indoor shoes or slippers
- Pajamas, underwear, socks
- Swim wear
- Warm waterproof jacket, shoes/boots, etc. it rains a lot in the winter!

Uniforms will be distributed during the orientation.

Toiletries & Personal Care

Shampoo, soap/body wash (travel size to start)

Towels (bath and face towels)

School Supplies

all supplies can be purchased at nearby stores. Typically, needed items include 3-ring binders, scientific calculator, pens, pencils, stapler, ruler.

Very Important

DO NOT bring any tobacco, alcohol or drug products, including e-cigarettes.

These are not allowed. Bodwell has a strict zero tolerance policy on cannabis (marijuana).

Any student found to be using, possessing or distributing cannabis or cannabis-related items will be dismissed from school.



How to Access Essential Services: Banking, Phone, and Mail Services



For students' banking needs

We invite a local bank representative to Bodwell during New Student Orientation to help students set up an account.



For cell phones and mobile devices

Students and parents are welcome to consider a local service provider here in Vancouver. Staff are not able to assist with bringing students to a cell phone shop, but students can connect to our campus wi-fi with most devices you bring or purchase.



For mail and packages

These can be addressed to your child's full name at the school's address. Mail and packages can be picked up from our Front Office.

Students/parents are responsible to know what items are not allowed on campus or in boarding (e.g. vapes – not permitted!).

Orientation for our new students includes:

- 1 Introduction of the school staff, and meeting with your counsellor.
- 2 Receiving your school uniform and computer.
- 3 Learning about safety, academics, health, cocurriculars, athletics, university, boarding and more.
- 4 Fun activities to get to know one another as new students, and meeting our Student Volunteers who are there to help you.



New Student Orientation for ALL new students will start at 8:00 am on August 27. Don't be late!

On Orientation Day, please bring the following to show your counsellor:

- 1. Latest report card, if not already presented (original versions)
- 2. Passport, study permit and visa, for international students
- 3. Any forms that should be returned to the school
- 4. Payments for outstanding fees (if any)
- 5. Any medical checkup, doctor's reports on recent illnesses or health concerns and prescriptions

Parents and Guardians are encouraged to attend New Student Orientation

We would love to meet you! You will get to know our staff and have your questions answered. We will also take you on a tour of our local community. You will receive a detailed orientation schedule in the coming months. For student privacy reasons, boarding hall access for parents will be limited to a specific day and time.
