Studying abroad is a life-changing experience! You will explore a new country, learn to live in a new culture, and be open minded to new customs and new languages.

We are happy to share some information in this guide to help prepare you for your safe travel to Canada and your experience in Canada. We look forward to meeting you!

<u>Introduction</u>

Please take time to read all the information in this guide and follow the instruction provided in each Step below. This information will help you follow the rules for entering Canada safely and be prepared for life in Canada.

Please note, to enter Canada:

- As always, travel documents are required:
 - Passport,
 - o 'Immigration Canada Letter of Introduction for a Study Permit,' or eTA, or Visitors Visa,
 - Nanaimo Ladysmith International Program Official Letter of Acceptance
 - Custodian Declaration
 - Also, the Government of Canada still recommends that you wear a well fitted mask while you travel.

Pre-Departure

Step 1 - iCent

Before arriving, download our Nanaimo Ladysmith International Program App called **iCent.** This app will have the latest updates and information you will need for planning your stay in Canada. All students are <u>required</u> to have this FREE app downloaded onto their phones prior to arrival.

Step 3 - Get to Know Your Homestay Family

- 1. Contact your Homestay family to get to know them. A video chat using Zoom, WhatsApp or WeChat is a good way. Remember to exchange emails, cell phone numbers, and WhatsApp numbers with your host family. Set up a text chat with your Homestay host before departure.
- **2.** Be sure to share your flight information and arrival times with your Homestay family AND ise@sd68.bc.ca as soon as possible. If there are last minute changes in your flights and arrival times, please inform both your Homestay host and email ise@sd68.bc.ca

Step 4 – Student Finances

Please discuss with your bank advisor, family, agent and/or students who have previously travelled in Canada about the best student banking card options for international travel to Canada. Your country's bank card may not always work in Canada. (Several students from Türkiye, Spain, and Brazil have had issues with their bank card.) It is recommended that students use a chip-based debit card from Visa or Mastercard. Some services such as fitness gyms no longer accept cash and require students to pay with Canadian credit card. If your credit or debit card does not work in Canada, we can help you set up a Canadian bank account with a Canadian debit card once you arrive. This is free for students.

Step 5 - A Canadian Phone Plan – For your personal safety, it is an ISE

<u>requirement</u> to have a Canadian phone plan, with data, for the duration of your stay in our program. In the event you need to access a Mobile Doctor, for medical help, you need a Canadian phone number. (Mobile Doctor will NOT work with WhatsApp or WeChat!)

We recommend you set up a phone plan for use in Canada before you leave your home country. Many international students in BC use PhoneBox but you can use any phone plan provider you choose if it gives you a Canadian number with a data plan. We have found that PhoneBox is the most convenient for international students to sign up for, because it does not require an adult to co-sign with a credit card. (Please note your Homestay family cannot sign for this service.) Also, it is very simple to end the services with PhoneBox.

PhoneBox offers plans for \$35/month + 12% taxes. There is also a 1-time SIM card fee but using the link below PhoneBox will waive that charge.

It is best to set up a phone plan **prior to departure** to ensure you have access to your phone once you arrive in Canada.

You can use an e-SIM or have your physical sim card delivered to your Homestay address, so it is ready for you when you arrive. We recommend that you use the e-SIM service. An e-SIM card is simple to use – you will be emailed a unique QR code.

Step 6 - Packing - Be sure to check with your airline on weight limits for your carry on and checked baggage.

Please note: It is best to keep your travel documents in a plastic pouch separate from your passport. Your passport should be always kept on you, at all times. In a pocket with a zipper or button, or in a passport holder hung around your neck.

Safe Travel Practices For All Students

While travelling to the airport, in airports and during flights:

Wear a Mask and Wash Your Hands

It is recommended you wear a mask. Wash your hands before you board the airplane and continuously use hand sanitizer. Touch as few surfaces as possible.



Keep Safe

When you get to your airplane seat it is a good idea to wipe it, and your meal tray, with a disinfectant wipe. Keep your cell phone charged in case you need to contact your host family. Bring some snacks in your carry-on bag.

Arriving in Canada

You finally made it! You will need to clear (go through) Canada Immigration and Customs before heading to your next flight on your journey to Nanaimo. Follow the passengers on your flight, as they are heading to Immigration as well. If you are uncertain where to go, ask an airport employee.

To prepare for Immigration, have the following documents ready:

- Your Passport, or eTA or Visitor Visa, or Immigration Canada 'Letter of Acceptance for a Study Permit'
 OR Study Permit (if you are a returning student.)
 - If you have an Immigration Canada 'Letter of Introduction for a Study Permit', this is where you will receive your Study Permit.
 - The barcode on this letter MUST be scanned while you are at the Immigration area.
 - Please make sure the Immigration Officer prints and gives you your STUDY PERMIT BEFORE leaving the immigration area.

Arriving in Nanaimo

Welcome to Vancouver Island!

- You will be greeted at the Nanaimo Airport or BC Ferry Terminal by a member of your Homestay family or an ISE staff member. Please keep your Homestay family updated on the status of your arrival. It will be easy to find your family or the ISE staff member as we have a small friendly airport.
- Gather your luggage, sanitize your hands, and get ready to say hello!

Participate in New Student Orientation Activities!

New Student Orientation Activities will take place during the last week of August 27 to 29. All new students will participate in an ISE Program Orientation and a School Orientation. Students will get to meet their Homestay Coordinator, School Advisor, and program staff. Most importantly, students will get to meet each other! Important information will be shared, and social connections will be encouraged.

New Student Orientation

<u>The ISE Program Orientation: August 27 and August 28</u> – learn about our schools, community, and Vancouver Island. Other topics will include international student activities & excursions, transportation, health services & safety, and program rules. Students and their Homestays will be given specific date and time of the ISE Program Orientation session upon arrival in Nanaimo and Ladysmith.

<u>School Orientation:</u> – learn about your assigned school, your course schedule, school expectations and culture, our computer systems (Google Classroom, Learn68, etc.) and school activities. Times and details about School Orientations vary based on the students' school, but most will take place on Friday, August 29.

If your flight is delayed, Do Not Worry! We will ensure you will receive the Program and School Orientation at an alternate time and date.

Other Important Information:

For the Love of Soccer - Playing Community or Club Soccer in Canada

All three clubs are governed by FIFA regulations and students need to obtain an International Transfer Certificate. This process can take anywhere from 2 weeks to 1 month, and students are unable to play in games with NUFC, Elite XI Soccer Academy, or Mid-Isle Soccer Club until the forms have been approved by Canada Soccer.

Step 1. Visit the three websites above and discuss with your parents if you want to apply to play club soccer while in Canada. If the answer is Yes, proceed to Step 2.

Step 2. Contact your club of choice at the website above and register with that club.

Step 3. Notify our department at <u>ise@sd68.bc.ca</u> of your intention and which club you have registered in. **The DEADLINE for this notification is July 15, 2025!**

- b. Obtain a colour scan of Player's Passport (photo page)

- e. Obtain a letter from Home Country Football Association stating whether the player has ever been registered with a member club, and if yes, was the player amateur or professional.

Step 5. All students who notified our office that they were interested in playing community soccer (Step 2) by July 15, will be contacted by our offices no later than Monday, July 21 with the how and when to submit your application to apply for an International Transfer Certificate.

At the Airport – Departing your Home Country

Arrival in Canada
