PRIOR to DEPARTURE

In an envelope, place the original or certified copies of your transcripts or report cards and 2 passport size photos - you will hand in this envelope during Orientation

Carry with you your Letter of Acceptance, and Custodian Declaration in case they are requested by Immigration. Upon receipt of your airline ticket, the Business Office will send you Pre-Arrival information and any required travel documents if applicable.



Before Arrival:

- Send us your flight ticket at least a week in advance, or let us know the day you will arrive if you do not need airport pick up
- Pick-up instructions will be sent to you when the e-ticket copy is received, and your pick-up is confirmed. If you do not receive an email, do not presume the pick-up is confirmed. Confirmation will include pick up instructions, including the meeting point and contact numbers. There is WIFI in the airport and you will be able to use TEAMS to contact staff.

Don't Forget:



- Voltage in Canada is 120V/60Hz, and most devices use an A-type plug, with two flat prongs
- You must bring a laptop with you, and a plug adaptor if necessary, or purchase one online to be delivered in advance.
- Let us know as soon as you get your visa!

Online Orientation

There will be an online orientation session with information on what to bring and what to expect over orientation. It will be held at 9am ET on July 23, 2025, via TEAMS. A TEAMS invite will be sent prior to the meeting.

Prior to Departure

In an envelope, place your original or certified copies of your transcript(s) and/or report cards and two (2) passport sized photographs. You will be handing this envelope in – please do not include any other papers in this envelope. If your school has only provided digital copies of reports, be sure to forward the original email to admissions@brontecollege.ca.

Be sure to carry with you when travelling your Visa approval letter (if applicable), Letter of Acceptance, and Custodian Declaration (if applicable), as these documents will be requested by Border Officers.

Airport Pickup

Please send an email to frontdesk@brontecollege.ca at least one week prior to your pickup. Pick-up instructions will be sent to you when the e-ticket copy is received, and your pick-up is confirmed. If you do not receive an email, do not presume the pick-up is confirmed. Please include the e-ticket, and clearly state the following in your email:

1. Airline and flight number
2. Date and time of arrival
3. Number of pieces of luggage

Kindly advise us promptly of any flight changes. Be sure to follow the instructions provided in the airport pick-up confirmation email. The instructions will include the meeting point and contact numbers. There is WIFI at the airport and you will be able to use TEAMS to contact staff.

Wednesday, August 27th, 2025

Please meet in the cafeteria at 9:00am on August 27th. Bring your envelope with your original or certified copies of your transcript(s) and/or report cards and two (2) passport sized photographs with you. Staff will assist you to get your ID cards, uniform and timetable. Breakfast starts at 7:30am on weekdays, 10:30am -12:30pm on weekends and holidays. Classes will begin Tuesday, September 2nd. If you miss the Wednesday Orientation session, it will be repeated August 28th at 1pm and August 29th at 9am.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What should I pack in my suitcase?

A: Please do not pack many thick sweaters. It is best to dress in layers even when it is cold outside; indoors you will need only a light sweater (when you are not in uniform). For outdoors, you must have a warm jacket, warm socks, mittens and/or gloves, a scarf and a hat. You must provide your own toiletries and towel. All items may be purchased in a local mall or online. Voltage in Canada is 120V/60Hz, and most devices use an A-type plug, with two flat prongs.

Q: Will someone be at the school if my flight arrives on a weekend or late at night?

A: The school is open 24 hours a day/ 7 days a week, 365 days a year. There is always someone present at the front desk. They will provide you with a welcome package and a staff member will take you and your luggage to your room. You will have WIFI.

Q: What does the school provide upon arrival in my room?

A: The school provides fresh bed sheets, a pillow and pillowcase, and comforter to all students. If you have a favourite pillow, you are most welcome to carry it with you. You may request a phone card when you arrive, so that you can call your family if you do not have a cell phone. Please, do not bring any small kitchen appliances, including kettles unless there is an automatic shut-off feature. Hot water dispensers are provided in the canteen and the common areas.

Q: What are the facilities close to the school?

A: Bronte College is located close to a major street in Mississauga and is a very short walk to a main bus route. Mississauga has excellent public transit and highway systems, providing easy access to downtown Toronto and Pearson International Airport. Medical buildings, convenience stores, banks etc. are all located within walking distance.

Q: What school supplies will I need?

A: All school supplies can be purchased at a mall close to Bronte College or online. You must bring a laptop with you, and a plug adaptor if necessary or purchase one online to be delivered in advance. Other suggested items include paper, 3 ring binder(s), pencils and pens, coloured pencils or markers, highlighters, erasers, glue sticks, compass and protractor, pencil sharpener, ruler marked in both in. and cm, scissors, sticky notes ("Post-it" notepads), USB or thumb drive. Teachers will advise if other supplies are required (graph paper, scientific calculator, etc.).

Q: What if I can't find my immunization record, or it is incomplete?

A: For students under the age of 18, inoculations are mandatory. If you do not have an immunization record, our nurse will arrange for you to receive inoculations. Vaccinations may not be covered by your health insurance.

Q: Where can I get a SIM card or phone package?

A: There is WIFI throughout Bronte College, the airport, and many public spaces. However, if you wish to have a SIM card, you may purchase a SIM card upon arrival at the airport, or from several companies at our local shopping mall. In addition, we have included information from PhoneBox on preordering a card and package. Further information and SIM cards will also be available at the school.

Check List

- Valid **Passport and Original Immigration documents** (if applicable), Visa Letter, PR card, etc.
- Copy of Letter of Acceptance, and Custodianship Declaration, if applicable.
- Travel Insurance (if applicable) (If you have purchased medical insurance through the School, it will be activated for the date of your arrival. *You may wish to purchase additional coverage for travel days.*)
- Original **transcripts/report cards** etc. or legally certified copies in an envelope with your name on it
- Include two (2) passport size photographs - please put your name on the back of the photographs.**
- Email your Immunization record prior to arrival.**

- Bank Draft/Canadian Cash**, to open a personal Bank Account if desired.
- Any **medications** you may need, prescriptions for eyeglasses if required.
- All **personal items** you may need such as towels, washcloths, flip flops, toiletries, etc.
- For the winter you will need warm shoes and boots, jackets (heavy and light), sweaters, gloves, scarf. Dressing in layers is recommended. Summer can be hot, but classrooms are air conditioned.
- A **laptop and school supplies**. We will provide the necessary software for word processing, spreadsheets and presentations. The laptop must have WIFI capabilities.
- Chargers and plug adaptors.
- If you are staying in the school residence or homestay, **all bed linen will be provided** (including sheets, a pillow, pillowcase and a comforter.)
- Put the TEAMS app on your phone so it is easy to reach us upon arrival.

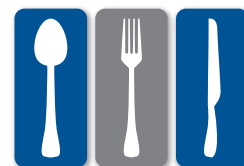

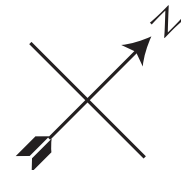
