IMPORTANT ARRIVAL AND ORIENTATION INFORMATION

After arriving on August 5th-7th, New Student Orientation will begin on August 7th for you to learn about living and learning at Windermere Preparatory School. During New Student Orientation, you will take part in the following activities:

- Tour the school and learn about school procedures
- Take academic placement tests, if needed
- Finalize or request changes to your schedule for the first semester after submitting all required enrollment documents and speaking with your college counselor
- Participate in organized activities to help you get to know the ResLife team and fellow students and become familiar with your house
- Learn residential rules and procedures
- Shop for school uniforms - 5 tops, 5 bottoms, Oxford shirt, blazer, tie (boys only), outerwear and physical education uniform (P.E.)
- Visit local retail store to purchase necessary personal items
- Open a U.S. bank account, if needed (student must be accompanied by a parent)
- Receive a physical and/or medical exam administered by a medical professional certified in Florida. The State of Florida requires physicals for all students. The student is responsible for the physical fee (up to \$125) which is due at the time of service.
- For **parents** - attend the New Parent Orientation meeting (time TBD). This event is for parents to learn more about our school and life at the ResLife Village

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Will I have roommates?

Students should expect to share a room with one other student. We will do our best to assign a roommate who is compatible based on your Roommate Questionnaire.

How are roommates assigned?

Roommates are assigned based on multiple factors, such as gender, grade level, age, and nationality. We will also take into consideration the results of your Roommate Questionnaire. One of our goals is to provide as much of a culturally diverse living environment as possible.

Where will I eat my meals?

SCHOOL DAYS:

Students are served breakfast and dinner at Marcy Hall which is located at the ResLife campus. Lunch is served in the high school cafeteria during assigned lunch hour. Students may choose to purchase additional food and beverage items for sale at the cafe or campus store and charge the cost to their student accounts. The account balance will be billed to the family on a monthly basis.

NON-SCHOOL DAYS (HOLIDAYS/WEEKENDS):

Brunch and dinner are served at the ResLife campus. Students may go to the local store to purchase food items they may store in their assigned kitchen cabinet.

How will I stay healthy?

Our menu is created by a team of dedicated chefs who are able to meet any special dietary needs due to allergies or religious beliefs. A meeting will be scheduled upon request in order to discuss options and specific needs. Students can stay fit by joining a school athletic team, participating in after school sporting activities, or other pre-approved off-campus extracurricular interests.

How will I clean my clothes?

Each ResLife housing unit is equipped with a washer and dryer. Prefects (student mentors) will teach you how to do your own laundry and properly operate the machines.

Can I leave campus on the weekend?

Students may leave campus with permission from ResLife and their parents. Special documentation and completed check-out procedures are required prior to departure. More information about student check-out policies, Uber Teen policies, and any additional requirements will be provided in the Pre-Arrival Packet and during Orientation.

What do we do during school holidays?

Windermere Preparatory School offers chaperoned trips for boarding students during Thanksgiving (November) and Spring (March) Breaks at no additional cost to the family. Information regarding the trips will be sent to families at a later date. During Winter Break (mid-December to early January), our ResLife campus will be closed, and students must go home or visit an approved friend or family member. Is there anyone I can talk to if I am having problems?

Students are encouraged to speak with any ResLife team member, teacher, academic advisor, guidance counselor, or school nurse about any questions or problems they might encounter. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to supporting our students and helping them to succeed. In addition, Windermere Prep has partnered with local mental health professionals who can provide regularly scheduled individual sessions at an additional cost.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (CONTINUED)

What should I bring with me?

- Appropriate clothing for after school and weekend activities
- Clothing in good condition with no profanity, drug/alcohol references or inappropriate images
- A jacket for colder weeks of the year
- Formal closed-toe dress shoes in black or brown for school formal dress days (ex. oxfords, loafers, ballet flats, etc.)
- Storage in each room is limited so please pack accordingly

What should I NOT bring?

Do not bring items that are offensive, prohibited or illegal including, but not limited to: cigarettes, vapes, lighters, drugs or drug paraphernalia, weapons, knives or alcohol. Students who bring items deemed to be illegal or dangerous into the dorms or onto the school campus will face disciplinary action up to and including expulsion.

Do not bring any medicine unless it is prescription medication accompanied by the Authorization for Administration of Prescription Medication Form. This form must be completed in English by a physician and a copy of the prescription must be attached. The school nurse will determine if the medication is approved for use in the U.S. If approved, all medicine must be administered by the School Nurse or Residential Staff Member. Students can only keep medication that has been approved by the school nurse.

What should I buy once on campus?

Once students arrive on campus, there will be trips to local stores to buy essentials such as bedding, towels, toiletries, snacks, notebooks and pencils, etc. ResLife team members can help recommend the items students might need and teachers will provide a list of supplies needed during orientation. Weekly trips are offered to stores throughout the year to purchase additional supplies.

What will be provided for me?

- One set of school uniforms, including: 5 tops, 5 bottoms, Oxford shirt, blazer, tie (boys only), outerwear and physical education (P.E.) uniform
- Bedroom furniture: bed, clothing storage, desk and chair



What kind of mobile phone should I bring?

All students should have a mobile phone with a U.S. number. Students will be provided a SIM card and basic plan, if needed. Students are required to maintain an active U.S. phone number while enrolled at WPS.

What type of computer should I bring?

Students are required to use a personal laptop computer at school. It needs to be able to connect to WiFi and have the ability to download or upload programs needed for school. Please review the WPS policy on Laptop specifications [here](#).

In the ResLife Village, desktop or gaming computers are not allowed in bedrooms but can be brought to use in common areas. Monitors cannot exceed 21 inches.

Should I bring money?

It is recommended that students keep only small amounts of cash on hand. For safety and security, students should not keep large amounts of money in their rooms. Windermere Prep is not responsible nor liable for any loss, theft, or damage to personal items. A small locker is available for each student in his/her room for storage of valuables. During orientation, it is highly recommended that students open a U.S. bank account to safely store their money. Parents must be present for students under the age of 18 to open a U.S. bank account.

ATHLETICS

What are the requirements to join an athletic team?

The Florida High School Athletic Association (FHSAA) has specific eligibility requirements for participation in team sports. Students must complete all forms required through FHSAA before participation. Forms are located in your Magnus account which will be sent to all families at a later date. Any students interested in participating must try out and be selected to join a team. Before a student is eligible to try out for a sport, they must have received a sports physical from a doctor's office in Florida. Physicals must be completed on a yearly basis and are required before participation is granted.

HEALTH

How will I know if I have all the necessary immunizations to attend school?

It is important to submit the Immunization Form as early as possible in the process so that Florida medical professionals may review it in time to let you know what is still missing. Florida has very specific rules about what is needed for students to attend school, and no student may go to school without having an up-to-date record. Therefore, any student arriving to school without the needed immunizations will be taken to the doctor during Orientation to receive these vaccines at a direct cost to parents (not covered by school insurance).

Is the health insurance policy included in tuition a full coverage policy?

No. It is not a full coverage policy, but a deductible plan with out of pocket expenses. Students will be responsible for a portion of the cost to be determined at the time of service by the doctor's office. Students will also need to pay at the time of service. You will receive more details about the coverage in future correspondence as well as details about an upgraded option. Health insurance is for international students only and does not apply to U.S. citizens.

ACADEMICS

When will I choose my classes?

Your designated college counselor will contact all students between June and July to create a tentative schedule of classes and electives. Students will take placement exams to confirm the appropriate course level before finalizing student schedules for the academic year.

What kind of academic support is provided?

The ResLife Program provides students with multiple opportunities for additional academic support. Parents will receive an their child's academic report from their child's House Parent. If any students show the need for a more structured study environment, they will be required to attend a Structured Study Hall from 8 PM - 9:30 PM outside of their assigned house in Marcy Hall. Students who may need additional help or tutoring are encouraged to meet with teachers first. If there is additional support needed, students may request a peer tutor at school at no additional cost, or parents can request a private tutor through school for an additional cost.

How will I prepare for my college/university applications?

College advising begins as soon as the student begins high school. This process is based on a comprehensive guidance curriculum and builds over four years. Our counselors help students identify their learning styles, academic areas of interest, explore career options, and encourage students in extracurricular and volunteering involvement, test prep, college identification, resume building, essay writing, and their applications. The advising process helps students learn about their college options so they can confidently submit applications to their best-fit colleges and universities. Standardized test preparation for university applications begins with the PSAT. The PSAT will be administered annually. In addition, students will also start taking Mock Exams for the SAT and ACT. Students will take their official SAT and ACT in the 11th grade as well as the TOEFL or Duolingo to ensure they are prepared for the actual applications. Each year Windermere Prep also has over 160 college representatives from all over the world to visit with our students on campus.
